# Lutcher crushes Ellender

LUTCHER — Once again, the Lutcher Bulldogs proved why they are the top ranked team in Class 4A and a nationally ranked club.

Behind five touchdown passes from quarterback Gavin Webster, the Bulldogs dropped Ellender 54-0 in a District 8-4A contest in which they led 20-0 after the first quarter, 34-0 at halftime and 54-0 at the end of the third quarter.

Lutcher, last season's Class 3A champion, moved to 8-0 overall and 3-0 in district, while the Patriots fell to 0-8 overall and 0-3 in district.

"We played against a real good football team," Ellender coach Tawaskie Anderson said. "The kids played hard and didn't give up. We didn't move the ball on offense like we wanted to. Defensively, we didn't play consistent. We made some plays, but we just played against a good football team."

The Bulldogs got a 4-yard score from Daniel Taylor, a 65-yard pass and catch for a score from Gavin Webster to Jarvis Landry and a 4-yard reception to Travis Englade from Webster to close out the scoring in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Webster ran for a 5-yard touchdown and hit Landry for a 34-yard passing strike for the 34-0 halftime advantage.

In the third quarter, Webster hit Jeffery Deslatte for a 9-yard score and Jamiah Sorapuru with a 2-yard score and Londres Johnson closed the scoring with a 20-yard run.

Lutcher ran for 284 yards on the night and Webster was 7-of-11 for 146 yards through the air.

Daniel Taylor led the Bulldogs with 107 rushing yards on nine carries, while Landry caught three balls for 107 yards and two scores.

Ellender quarterback Justin Billiot completed three passes for 60 yards, all to receiver Jermaine Johnson.

"We've been very consistent, and I've got a lot of respect for Ellender," Lutcher coach Tim Detillier said. "It's hard when you are winless, but they played every play hard."

Lutcher travels to Houma next week for a big district game against Vandebilt Catholic (4-4 overall, 3-0 in district).

"Whoever wins the game gets at least a share of the title," Detillier said. "No matter how you cut it, it's a district championship game next week."
